

Holladay and Foundation Aid Fiji

Terry Holladay grew up in La Jolla and was a standout touring pro in the boom years of the '70s. For 13 years, she competed around the world and earned wins over Hall of Famers Billie Jean King, Martina Navratilova and Margaret Court.

These days, Holladay is still active in tennis. She teaches at Fairbanks Ranch Country Club and coaches at Santa Fe Christian School, which her eleven-year-old daughter attends. She continues to pursue a career in real estate, but perhaps the activity closest to her heart is the Loloma Foundation.

Loloma literally means "From the Heart." She and her husband, Dr. Philip Higginbottom, are avid supporters of the charity that provides medical treatment, living materials and other vital necessities to impoverished Fijian villages and surrounding South Sea Islands. In Fiji, the Loloma Foundation has set up a medical clinic for those most in need.

During her worldwide travels, Holladay often saw others not as fortunate as she is. She now donates her tennis income to the Loloma Foun-
